

Scripture: Romans 13:8-14

OPEN:

1. When you think about the word 'love' - not the romantic or soft kind, but the kind that could make a whole law - what comes to mind?

DIG:

2. If love is the fulfillment of the law, as Paul says, what does that mean for how we handle people we disagree with or even find morally wrong?
3. Paul talks about 'waking from sleep' because 'salvation is nearer now.' In your life today, what would truly 'waking up' look like — and what are you still asleep to?
4. Paul warns against indulging in things like drunkenness, jealousy, and sexual immorality. Are these just examples, or is there a deeper issue underneath all these behaviors that we're still facing today?
5. What would it actually mean to 'put on the Lord Jesus Christ' instead of just believing in Him — and where do we see people faking it versus truly living it?
6. When Paul says not to make 'provision for the flesh,' is he calling for discipline, denial, or something more radical — and how does that clash with today's obsession with comfort and self-expression?

REFLECT:

1. When have you been slumbering in your faith? How did you wake up?
2. How would your life be different today if you had consciously tried to "wear" Jesus Christ? What will you have to change to ensure a better fit?
